Report from the Safety Officer, Howard Sklar, AP-IN

DSC - Digital Selective Calling

How many of us know what this is, or how to use it and when? DSC is a distress calling feature on most newer VHF radios. The DSC feature uses the Maritime Mobile Service Identity (MMSI) number that requires the boat owner to register for. A DSC call allows boaters to instantly send an automatically formatted distress signal to the Coast Guard and/or others anywhere in the world.

Remember you must register or update your MMSI information through either our own America's Boating Club, Boat US, or the FCC. Failing to register your MMSI information greatly impacts the Coast Guard SAR (Search & Rescue) response. What is MMSI anyway? It is a 9-digit number that uniquely identifies your boat from all others. It registers the boat giving the vessel's name, description, owner information etc.

Clearly an up to date MMSI database greatly reduces the USCG's and others' response time to locate your vessel's distress. MMSI registration takes the Search out of an SAR incident.

An interesting and concerning statistic: 60% of DSC distress calls used MMSIs that were either made up or from unregistered boaters. Interestingly enough, most of these distress calls were from vessels that had not undergone a Vessel Safety Check.
